# Record breaker Rio jumping for joy









#### Rio Davies with his recent athletics medals

Rio Davies' athtletics career is coming on leaps and bounds.

Rio, who is 12 and lives with his parents Chloe and Micky on Lowfield Close, Ranskill, recently broke a record for long jump in the county, a record that had stood for six years.

His latest achievement was in early July at Berry Hill, Mansfield where he beat the Nottinghamshire Mini League record for U13 boys' long jump, with a leap of 5.03m.

The previous record of 4.75m had been held since 2018. Rio has been preselected to repesent Nottinghamshire in the inter counties in September.

Rio, a pupil at the Elizabethan Academy, joined Retford Athletic Club in 2022 and competes in 100m, 200m and long jump. In May he won gold at the Nottinghamshire County Championships in 100m (12.91 seconds), long jump (4.78m) and also got a silver in 200m (26.76 seconds).

Mum Chloe said: "He definitely gets his athleticism from his dad who is a retired professional boxer and still spends time pounding the pavement!

"He aspires to keep learning and developing, getting faster and jump further and hopefully compete for Nottinghamshire at the National schools when he is old enough to attend, and see where he goes from there.

"Both myself and his dad are super proud of him, his commitment to training come rain or shine, surviving his first year of secondary school and generally just being a really lovely person!" She added: "I am also so grateful for the dedication of all the coaches and volunteers at RAC - they really are a fantastic and postive group that Rio loves being around and I hope they can continue to keep growing his confidence and hopefully break some more records together."

Coach Marjolein Templeton described Rio as a good all-round athlete.

She said: "Rio is one of our team of talented U13 Boys at Retford AC. He is a pleasure to coach.

"Over the track and field season Rio has continued to deliver some excellent results in sprinting and surprises us all with his amazing distances in long jump, having recently reached the England Athletics Gold Standard for his age."

In October 2023 Chris, together with wife Rebecca, made the decision to move away from York after the impact of Covid had decimated the high street, changing everything for those in a retail environment. Having finally 'moved in' last January the couple have fallen in love with village life and see Scrooby very much as their home. 'The people are lovely and it is such a pretty, caring village', said Chris.

An Ambassador for the world famous Canson brand of fine art

paper, Chris is often at major events in the U.K, also working alongside Canon on print events. He runs a series of inspirational talks and evenings that offer something for the photographer, and non-photographer alike. On 29th August he is presenting his very popular, documentary style 'Venice, In Pictures & Words' evening at the Phoenix Theatre, Bawtry (tickets £6 on Eventbrite).

In the studios you can browse 16 racks of mounted, museum grade prints and on the walls there are framed prints, Canvases and wall art panels. Chris makes a series of over 300 greeting card designs which he has sold to shops over the past 17 years, and these can also be bought at the studios. He

holds 'Open Weekends', though he is more than happy to meet visitors 'by appointment'. If Chris is in, the studios are open. The next open weekend is Sat 10th/Sun 11th August and a guest art-related exhibitor, will attend.

Chris also offers both a print service for photographers, and an artwork reproduction service for artists who want to make limited edition runs of their originals on the Canson Fine Art papers.

## **Christian Perspective—Light**



At this time of year it's great to have plenty of daylight in the evenings, so we can be gardening or doing jobs outside around the house after

tea. We might ask ourselves—what is light and how does it differ from darkness? If we want to see where we are going we need light. When Jesus was talking to his followers in the sermon on the mount, he said to them: You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. Matthew 5:14-16

This seems a scary and weighty responsibility for us to show the light of God to the world around us. Life can often be discouraging, and we don't have the strength in ourselves to make God's love and light known. But I am encouraged when I read in John's Gospel, Jesus saying: I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. John 8:12. Suddenly the pressure is off and I realise it's not my job to create the light and present God's goodness to the world, but it's the person of Jesus who brings this.

John tells us at the beginning of his Gospel that Jesus was with God in the beginning and all things were made through him. Then he tells us: *In him was life and that life was the light of mankind. John 1:5* 

This is where we get the light from to give us understanding and strength to live for him and make a difference in the world. When we invite Jesus to come and abide in us, he comes with his life and his light and makes us new creations. We can receive from him and give it away to others. Sometimes we look around us and become discouraged at the state of the church and the world and feel downcast. But Paul, when he writes to the Colossians in chapter 3, points out that inviting Christ to live within means we have also been raised with him. And we should then set your hearts and minds on things above, not look at the things around us.

The result of this is from verse 12: as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and pa-

tience. He also speaks of forgiveness, love, peace and thankfulness. and letting the word of Christ dwell in us richly. And suddenly the life and light of Christ is shining in us and touching those around us. Let his light shine in you and see how it first lifts vour own heart and then blesses those around you.
